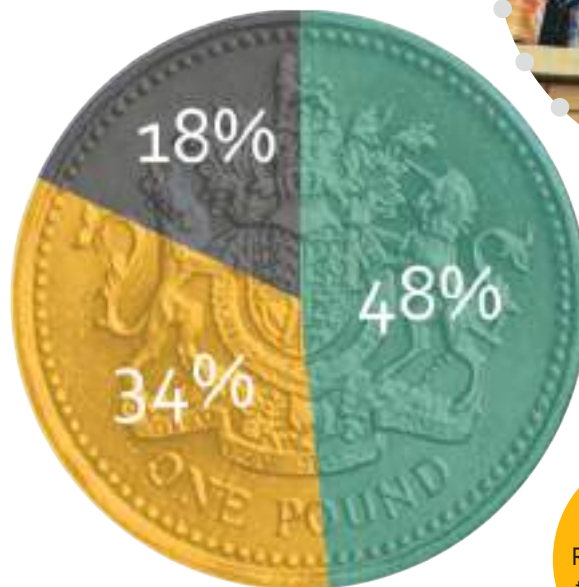

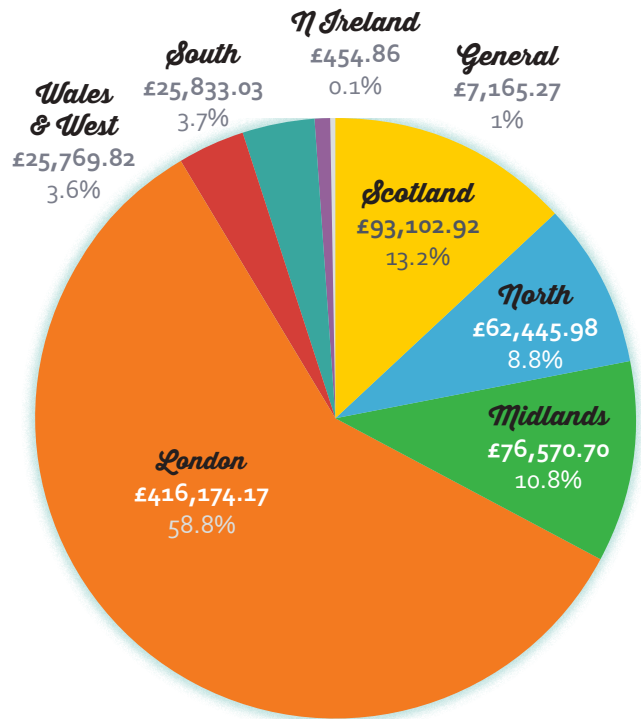
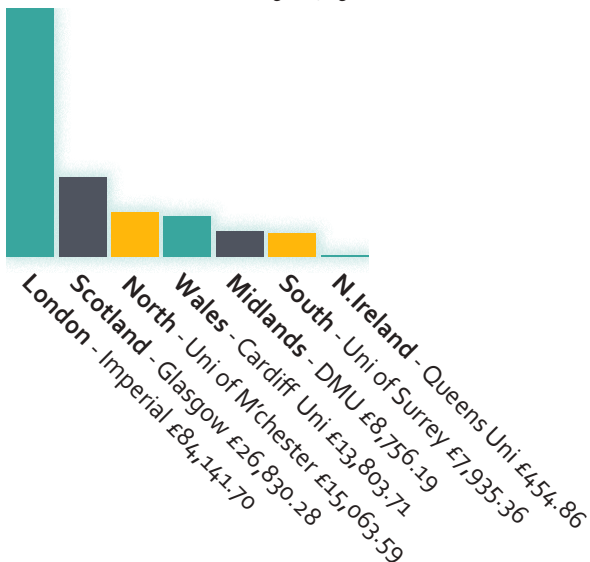
Top 5 Universities

Top Institutions by Region

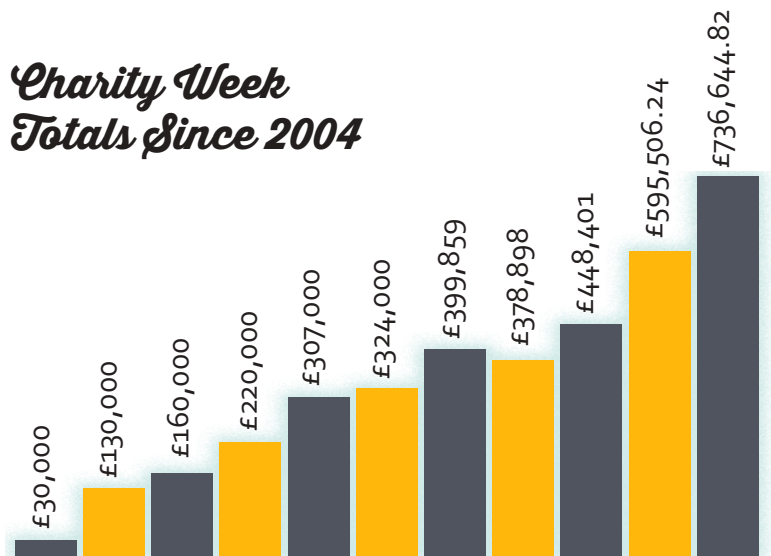

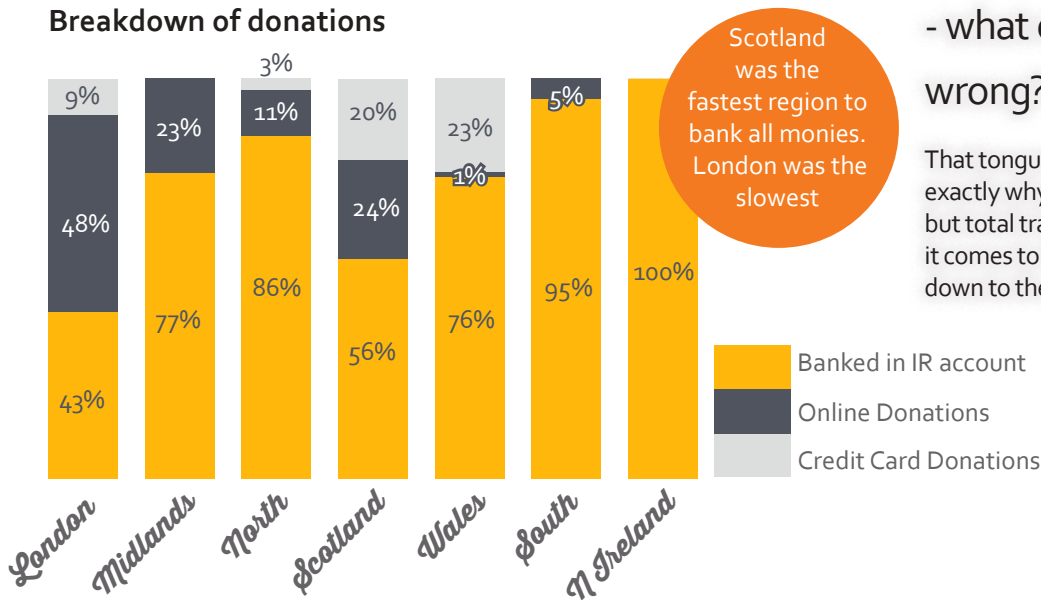
