# Syria

## ISLAMIC RELIEF HAS BEEN PROVIDING LIFESAVING AID IN YEMEN SINCE 1998.

We are a lifeline for thousands of families whose lives are impacted every day by the protracted crisis in Yemen.

Responding swiftly to emergencies, we've distributed much needed aid such as medicine, food and water as well as clothing, shelter and personal hygiene items. Families pushed to the brink by poverty received social assistance and support with access to food and safe shelter. Islamic Relief also sponsors thousands of orphaned children, helping to meet their basic needs and making sure they can go to school.

During the Covid-19 outbreak, food aid distributed by Islamic Relief was a lifeline for over 2.3 million people. We also distributed facemasks and handwash, as well as supporting health facilities and quarantine centres with personal protective items, food supplies, medicine and training.

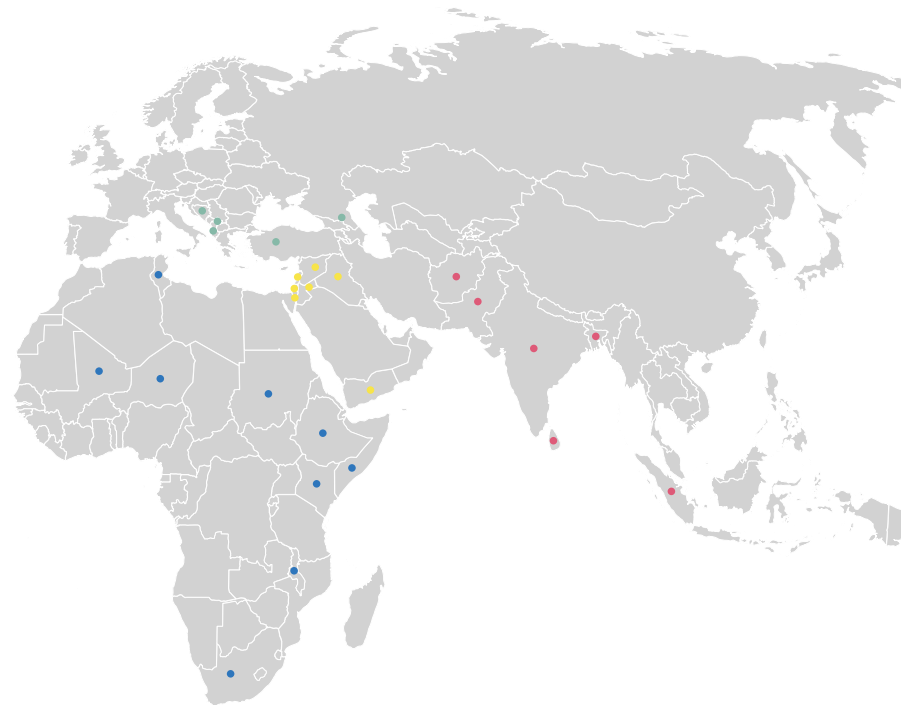

As temperatures dropped and the dark winter nights set in, our Winter Appeal focussed on those who don't have the luxury of heating or hot water.

For the millions of people living in poverty worldwide, there's no central heating, no thick blankets and no cosy home to settle into as temperatures start to fall.

With your support we distributed critical aid to some of the world's most vulnerable people. From Syria and Yemen, to Pakistan, Myanmar, Afghanistan and Bangladesh, we provided winter essentials to help save lives.

Your donations helped provide critical winter supplies including: winter clothes, firewood, fuel, mattresses, blankets, food, stoves and electric heaters to help keep people safe and warm during the winter.



# Water

Water is the key to all life. Yet across the globe, a staggering 785 million people are going thirsty each and every day. Without safe and clean water to drink, these people risk dehydration, disease and worse: death.

Everyday communities across the globe are in need of safe sources of water for drinking, washing, cooking, rearing livestock and watering crops. Yet for millions of people, this simple essential is out of reach.

With your support Islamic Relief was able to provide over 800,000 beneficiaries in 19 countries such as Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Gaza, Syria and Yemen with access to safe and clean drinking water. This was done by creating water wells and maintaining established water systems, improving the living conditions, and minimising the risk of disease associated with dirty water.







The coronavirus pandemic had a heavy and sustained impact on the lives of people all over the world. Countries have been under lockdowns, towns and cities quarantined, healthcare systems have struggled, places of worship closed, jobs were lost as companies closed down, families and friends have been kept apart to slow the spread of the disease.

Islamic Relief has been on the forefront of the fight of Covid-19 throughout our 35 offices across the globe. With your support, in 2021 we provided over 780,000 vulnerable people with health and hygiene care in areas such as Syria, Yemen and India, your support has helped us provide communities in critical need by providing:

- Food assistance and grants for orphaned children
- Hygiene kits including hand gloves, masks, toilet rolls, disinfectants and hand sanitisers
- Awareness-raising leaflets on how to keep safe

# Emergency

When an emergency strikes, Islamic Relief aims to be the first on the ground, providing emergency relief and helping those affected immediately. When floods, droughts or earthquakes happen, we're there: providing life-saving food, water, shelter, medicine and other essential items to families who have lost everything.



## PALESTINE

In May 2021, an 11-day escalation in the conflict caused devastation in Gaza. Over 250 people were killed – including 66 children – and nearly 2,000 residents were injured. Rockets destroyed 300 buildings, including more than 1,100 housing units. Thousands more homes were damaged, as were several hospitals and primary care centres.

## AFGHANISTAN

In 2021, the people of Afghanistan faced intensified conflict. To make matters worse, the country suffered its worst drought in decades. # South Africa



Food insecurity is a global crisis, impacting many countries. South Africa is no exception. At least 11.8 million people in SA are unable to meet their nutritional needs and 2.5 million South Africans experience hunger every day. The situation has been exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic, resulting in job-losses, increased food prices, and general economic decline. A large proportion of the South African population currently require urgent action to reduce nutrition shortfalls and to protect livelihoods.

Our distributions around the world are carefully designed to harness the power of Zakat: we want to not only help people in poverty today, but support them to escape poverty for good. Our rigorous governance makes sure that, from the moment you donate to the moment it is handed over to those who have a right to receive it, your Zakat is in safe hands, distributed only to those who are eligible under the eight categories stipulated in the Qur'an.

With your Zakat, we can bring relief and hope to people in desperate need.
